

Formweb: DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that Formweb offers options to your drug detail layout?

The “classic” layout looks like this:

acetaminophen
BRAND NAMES: Acephen, Acetaminophen (generic), Children's Acetaminophen, Feverall, Mapap, Mapap Children's, Ofirmev

CAPSULE, ORAL: 500 mg
LIQUID, ORAL: 160 mg/5 mL
SOLUTION, INTRAVENOUS: 10 mg/mL
SUPPOSITORY, RECTAL: 80 mg; 120 mg, 325 mg, 650 mg
SUSPENSION, ORAL: 160 mg/5 mL
TABLET, CHEWABLE, ORAL: 80 mg
TABLET, ORAL: 325 mg, 500 mg

However, Rpharmy has implemented a way to display your brands, forms, & strengths in a design that also allows you to point out facility-based categories or restrictions:
